The Best Of The Best



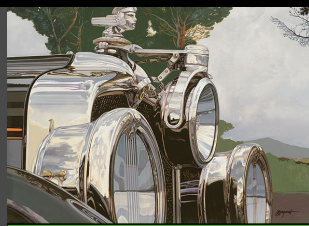

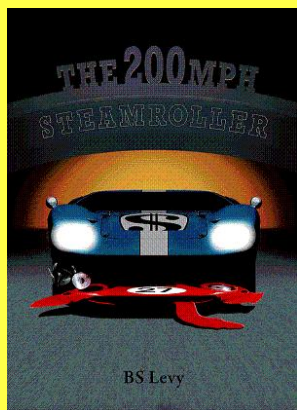
